Martin Theophilus

Responsible for policy at DPW is a three-member board appointed by the governor. Current members of the Board of Public Welfare are: George Butler, chairman (Houston); H. G. "Pete" Andrews, vice chairman (Stamford); and Garrett Morris, secretary (Fort Worth).

The attitude of the Department of Public Welfare toward child abusers is non-punitive. It is always the aim of the Department to keep the child in its own home, if possible, and to rehabilitate the home.

Texas law now makes it a misdemeanor not to report child abuse. The law provides immunity from prosecution to those making reports, unless the report was made in malice.

## CHILD ABUSE FACT SHEET

CHILD ABUSE is divided into three categories: physical abuse, sexual abuse, and emotional abuse.

A. PHYSICAL ABUSE is inflicting physical injury on a child.

B. SEXUAL ABUSE is forcing a child to engage in sexual activities.

C. EMOTIONAL ABUSE is regularly, and over an extended period of time, demanding that a child do more than he is capable of doing and criticizing and humiliating him for not living up to the demand; or making such unclear requirements that the child simply cannot understand what he is supposed to do.

NEGLECT is divided into two categories: physical neglect and emotional neglect.

A. PHYSICAL NEGLECT is failure to provide sufficient food, clothing, shelter, medical care, education, guidance, and supervision.

B. EMOTIONAL NEGLECT is failure to provide a child with love and affection.

Latest figures estimate the child population under 18 years of age in Texas to be 4,823,151.

Approximately 4,000 cases of suspected child abuse were reported in 1973 in Texas and 2,509 were confirmed. Of these, 135 were cases of sexual abuse.

Child abuse is one of the leading causes of infant mortality in the U.S.

There were at least 104 child abuse deaths in Texas in 1973.

Abused children range in age from infants to adolescents. Fifty percent are six years of age or younger.

All kinds of parents abuse their children. A Texas study done in 1973 shows that confirmed reports had twice as many Anglos as Mexican-Americans and Blacks combined. This is about the same percentage as the ethnic makeup of our state.

Studies show that child abusers are from all strata of society; from all ethnic groups; from all religious persuasions.

Abusing parents most often have experienced defective parental care themselves.

Child abusers are not necessarily psychotic or mentally ill. Studies show that the proportion of psychotics among child abusers is less than 10 percent.

Child abusers are characterized by immaturity and insecurity. They are often immature parents who look to their children for the very support and love they should be giving.

The Department of Public Welfare is the agency charged by Texas law with the protection of Texas children.

The State Department of Public Welfare maintains a child abuse report system at its central office in Austin. It is called CANRIS (for "Child Abuse and Neglect Report and Inquiry System"). CANRIS maintains a history of reported child abuse and neglect cases in Texas, so that a worker in the field can have ready reference to the computer files, and can see if a family has any prior history of child abuse or neglect. The procedure takes only minutes.

## Abuse, Neglect, Exploitation

Child abuse is the deliberate injury of a child by the person who is responsible for his care.

Child neglect is any action, or failure to take action, which damages the child's health and well-being.

Child exploitation is using a child in ways which are harmful to the child for the benefit of an adult.

The problems of abuse, neglect and exploitation are nationwide and occur among families of all classes, neighborhoods, races, and creeds.

Children suffer physical and emotional injuries ranging from temporary and mild to severe and permanent. Sometimes they are crippled. Sometimes they die as a result of injuries. Many suffer emotional damage which leaves them fearful, insecure and suspicious.

Texas law provides protection from such treatment.

## For All Children

The protection of Texas children from abuse, neglect, or exploitation is a fundamental responsibility of the State Department of Public Welfare.

While most of the Department's work is with needy people, its child protection services extend to every child without regard to income or any factor other than age.

All allegations of child abuse, neglect or exploitation must be investigated by the Department to determine their validity and to take action when it is warranted.

## Child Abuse Registry

To help control child abuse, the Department maintains a Child Abuse Registry in the State Office at Austin. All cases of child abuse—but not of neglect or exploitation—are reported to the Child Abuse Registry.

The Registry makes it possible to identify and control chronic offenders more easily.

## Local Services

In some communities, child protective services are provided by local authorities and facilities. The State Department of Public Welfare's child protective services are statewide except for such locally-served places.

## Everyone Can Help

Any person who knows of situations involving abuse, neglect or exploitation of a child is urged to report them to the Department.

The law provides protection from liability, except when such reports are made with malice.

Every effort is made to keep the identity confidential, but persons reporting such cases may be required to testify in court if necessary.

## Child-Centered

Protective services of the Department are child-centered. This means that every action of the Department is taken with the well-being of the child

in mind. The first objective is to remove whatever threat exists to the child's health, safety, or well-being.

## Family-Focused

Activities of the Department in protective cases are family-focused, which means that the goal is always restoration of the family unit if possible. Thus whatever action has to be taken, even including court-ordered removal from the home, the social services worker attempts to get at the causes of the distress in the home, help the family to correct them, and restore the child to the family.

## Removal From The Home

In situations presenting serious threats to the well-being of the child, the Department may file a report with the county or district attorney, who is responsible for deciding if court action is needed.

If a court decides a child should be removed from the home, the Department, when asked by the court, will assist in planning substitute care and provides services to the child while he is in such care.

The type of substitute care available varies from county to county, largely dependent upon provision of financing from counties and communities.

The Department attempts to arrange the care most suitable for the individual child within the limits of available facilities and resources.

If it is impossible for the child to return home, and if no relatives are able to make a home for him, the Department, with the consent of the court,

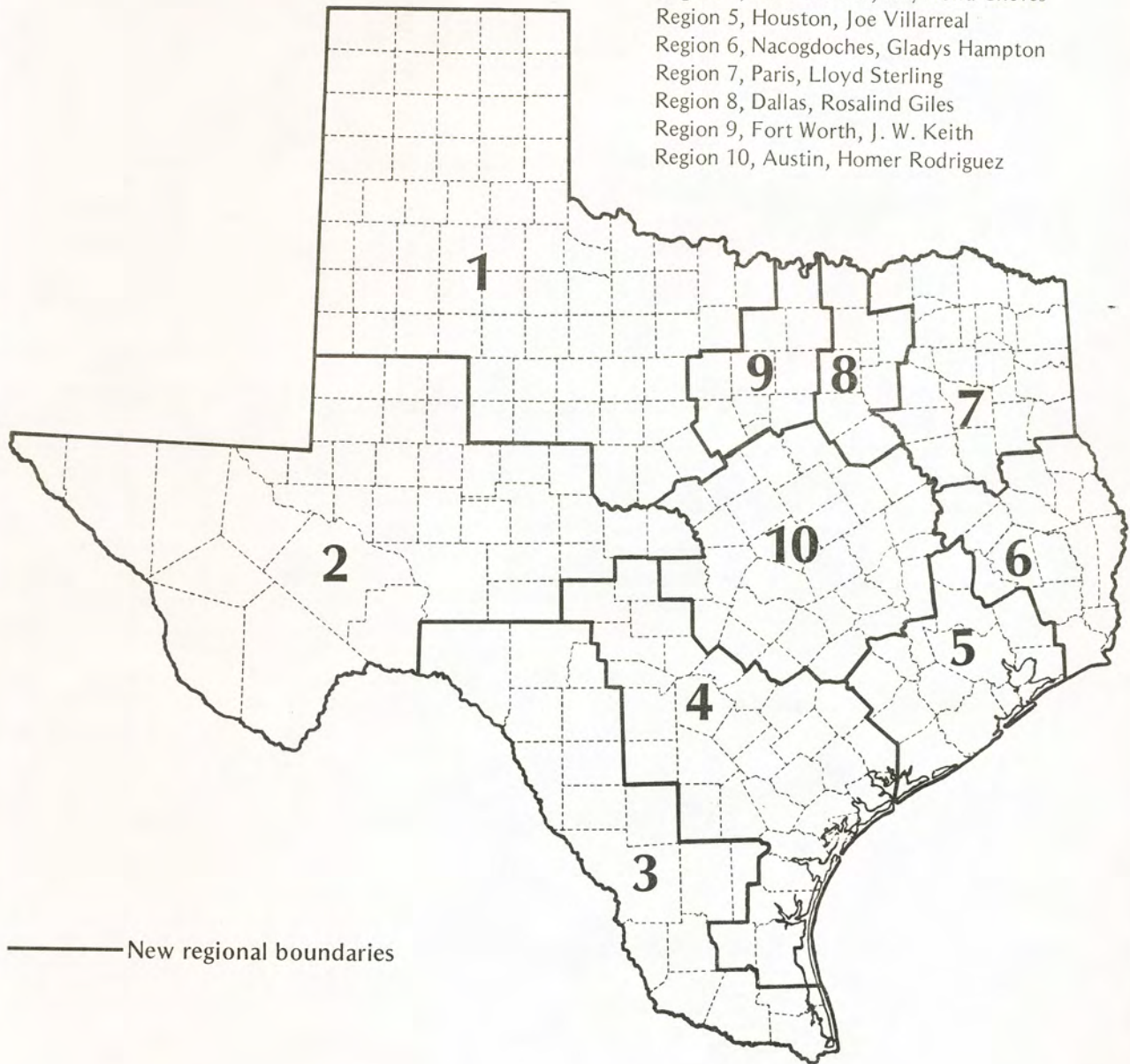
