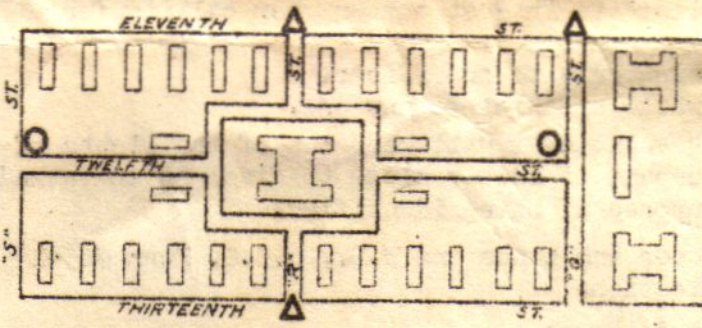
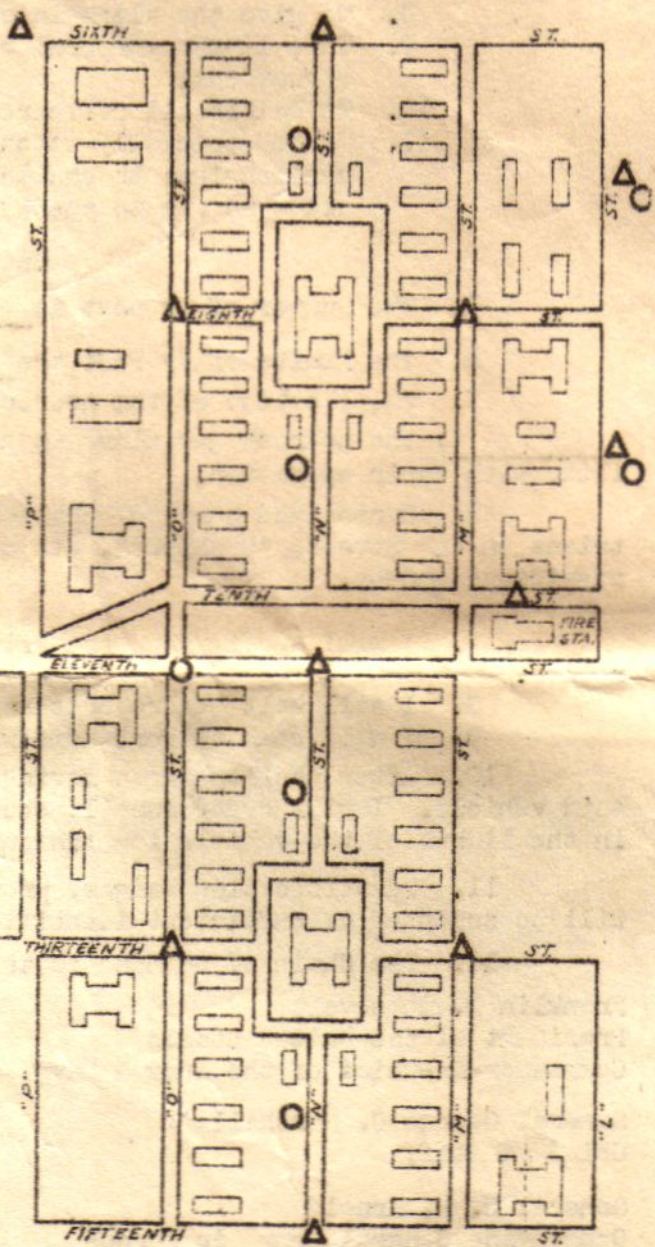

1. I report on Interior Guard Duty on _____ at _____

2. My General Orders are:

1. Take charge of this post and all Government property in view.
2. To walk my post in a military manner, keeping always on the alert and observing everything that takes place within sight or hearing.
3. To report all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce.
4. To report all calls from posts more distant from the guardhouse than my own.
5. To quit my post only when properly relieved.
6. To receive, obey and pass on to the sentinel who relieves me all orders from the commanding officer, officer of the day, and officer and noncommissioned officers of the guard only.
7. To talk to no one except in line of duty.
8. To give the alarm in case of fire or disorder.
9. To call the corporal of the guard in any case not covered by instructions.
10. To salute all officers and all colors and standards not cased.
11. To be especially watchful at night, and, during the time for challenging, to challenge all persons on or near my post and to allow no one to pass without proper authority.

6. During the hours of challenge, I will not challenge vehicles or pedestrians on "L" Street, "O" Street, 6th Street and 11th Street unless they act in a suspicious manner.

7. I will prefix the word "Pilot" to my Post number when calling for relief.

8. I will halt before presenting arms to an officer.

9. I will come to Port Arms while speaking to any one.

10. After challenging a moving vehicle, I will keep out of the lights of said vehicle. I will order one (1) occupant of said vehicle to dismount and stand in the lights of the vehicle for the purpose of being identified.

11. Identification badges, proper arm bands and W.D., A.G.O. Form #65-1 will be accepted as sufficient identification.
